Presidential Report

For the Diamond Jubilee Year (2017-18)

Baroda Management Association, founder member of the All India Management Association (AlMA) completed 60 glorious years in 2017-18. In this Diamond Jubilee year, BMA set new benchmarks in many events. The Diamond Jubilee year kick started on 28th May 2017 during the Annual Management Day where we had Mr. Parindu Bhagat (Kakubhai), Director IOCL as chief guest and Dr. Adil Malia, Partner, FIRM, as Guests of Honour where my team consisting of Mr. Rajiv Thakkar, Vice President, Mr. Anand Majmundar, Hon. Secretary and Dr. Nilesh Munshi, Hon. Treasurer took over the reins of Baroda Management Association for the Diamond Jubilee year with humility, gratitude and resolve.

60 years is a long journey and BMA has reached at this height due to the hard work which has been put in by all the past presidents starting from the founder president Late **Mr. Nanubhai Amin**, Silver Jubilee President **Mr. A J Sheth**, Golden Jubilee President **Mr. Devanshu Vaishnav** to IPP **Ms. Avi Sabavala.** I feel proud to share that BMA was unanimously recommended for the prestigious AIMA Best Local Management Association Award 2016-17 for consistently doing excellent work for the promotion of best management practices. BMA has been the recipient of this award 16 times, which is a record in itself.

It was a time to build upon the strong foundation and scale new heights. Our first event of the Diamond Jubilee Year was a special event which was planned on GST as it was the most talked subject during that time. We had registrations of more than 130 delegates. The event was planned on 12th August 2017 by BMA

strategically since by this date, the Trade, Commerce and Industry in India had experienced the first month of the historical tax reform and was now able to appreciate the practical aspects of the GST. The issues which are practical and theoretical relating to the implementation of GST and most importantly the conflicts with other laws applicable to manufacturing and sale of various products covered under GST. A Management Development Programme on the GST Act was conducted on 12th Aug, 2017 at The Gateway Hotel (Taj) by Baroda Management Association to try and remove many gaps in the knowledge and help the Traders / Business owners / Corporate bodies interact with the learned panel of speakers. The Chairman of MDPs Mr Chandresh Makhija started the programme by addressing the 132 odd participants. He said, "Much has been published about the new tax law since its launch on 1st July, 2017 and has been discussed very vigorously in many forums, but the number of participants present today is indicative of the fact that there are many grey areas where the tax law is still not understood and hence difficult to implement. To facilitate this we have with us a unique panel of speakers who would take you through the complete journey of how's and whys of this unique GST Act. He then introduced the young and dynamic President of BMA Mr Gaurish Vaishnav to kick start the knowledge series. The first speaker of the day was CA Mr Nirav Shah, a practising chartered accountant of repute, who took the entire 90 minute session on what the old system of taxation was (Sales Tax, Excise, Import Duty, Service Tax etc.,) He gave a case to case study of how each scenario would be taxed in the old and new system with detailed understanding of GST: SGST-CGST-IGST&UTGST.

LIMITATION OF OLD SYSTEM

- 1. Multiplicity of taxes and rates
- 2. Entry barriers across States
- 3. Cascading of taxes
- 4. Goods V/s Services Controversy
- Lack of Uniformity
- Multiple Administrations

He also touched upon the meaning of "Input tax credit & Supply". A round of question answer session started off with never ending questions from the audience. BMA eventually announced a HELP DESK to answer the queries sent in (email only) by the participants and all members of BMA to be answered by the experts. The second session was addressed by Advocate Mr Nayan Sheth explaining in detail the journey of how GST Act was formed, its pitfalls, discussions between the central and state governments, reaching a consensus between the two on sharing of tax, revenue etc.

He also touched upon how the taxable events started off in the old and new systems and what triggered the event for collection of tax, at what rate and by whom. He also touched upon how the new Tax Law would avoid duplicity of taxation, redundant refund practices bringing in more transparency and authenticity for paying tax, Mr. Sheth explained how the emphasis on digital payments, e-filing, auto refunding will make the law more vibrant and encompass all the traders, manufacturers and service providers.

The third expert of the day was an IRS Officer, Mr. Sanjay Saraswat, Superintendent of GST, Vadodara. A learned officer giving insights on role of:

- GST council members and their inputs on how to simplify the taxation format
- Role of IT infrastructure to facilitate compliance and **GST Credits**
- Assessment and penalty
- Meaning of Work Contracts, Job Works, Intra-state and Inter-state supply etc.

His explanation with case studies along with patient answers to the participating candidates made it worthwhile. The last speaker was **Advocate Yogen Mahadevia** who has more than 45 years of experience in presenting cases on Sales Tax, VAT & Service Tax. He explained in detail about registration, Input tax, Credit and Invoice, Returns & Assessment. Vote of Thanks was proposed by BMA's Vice President Mr. Rajiv Thakkar. All in all a very fruitful session wherein all the 132 candidates had lot of compliments for BMA team on this enlightening MDP.

senior disciple of H.H. Swami Dayananda Saraswati. Swamiji received comprehensive learning in Vedanta, Sanskrit and Yoga under the able guidance of his guru. He said, first try to understand the problem and thereafter consider the solutions. Just as every doctor first diagnoses the problem then only he comes to the solution. Society is in becoming mode, there are always commas, semicolons but not the full-stop. It goes into Pepsi mode, Dil mange more. Fine, but at least learn to enjoy what we have! According to Swamiji......In the process of gaining what we do not have we lose what we already have.

SESSION - III



Dr. Avinash Phadke

The session after lunch was on, Health, Health Care and Pharma, first speaker was Dr. Avinash Phadke is President & Mentor at SRL Diagnostics, Mumbai. He spoke on "Opportunities in the area of Pathological testing" Healthcare is an insulated business with a wide scope unlike areas of Radiology which is capital intensive, pathology is not capital intensive. It has shown a healthy growth of 15% per annum where the Indian diagnostic industry is at estimated at 30,000 crores. According to him, 30% of this business rests in hospitals, 15 % is in the organized sector and the balance 55% is in the largely



unorganized sector. Dr. Phadke said the demand is huge and growing. The demand of molecular and genetic diagnosis reduces time taken for diagnosis and is growing at 25 to 30%. While organised sector may cannibalise part of the unorganised sector, while drawing a parallel with the pharma industry, he said small business will continue to grow. However, accreditation will become compulsory very soon. He said there is a great challenge for the entrepreneurs vis-a vis large corporates as technology changes every 5-6 years hence the need for fresh investments arises which smaller businesses cannot afford.

In the end he mentioned the following as Growth drivers: Health awareness, Insurance and Employment requirement.

The next Speaker was Dr. Subroto Das (Padma Shree). He is the recipient of many awards including one of India's highest civilian awards, Padma Shree for his work on Highway Trauma Care. He co-founded Lifeline Foundation with the aim of reducing the 1,00,000+ annual highway deaths in India. The major topic that he covered was on road accidents and safety measures. Passionate about Road Safety due to his own experience of going through a bad road accident, he and his wife decided to do something sustainable and went for the EMS in the country. Their efforts have gone on to become Case Studies 📤 Dr. Subroto Das at Harvard, Boston & TISS.

Mr. Sriram lyer

The Last Session of The First Day was On Financial and FMCG Sector. Mr. Sriram lyer, carries a rich and varied experience having held leadership positions across MNC Banks and Financial Institutions. He is currently leading the Anand Rathi groups foray into the Digital Wealth Management space as the CEO for AR Wealth Management Ltd. His topic was "Connecting the Dots". Digital Disruption has happened everywhere he said, even in the financial sector. The skill set one had or has are getting redundant even before we realize it. He gave the example of the imminent impact or Driverless electric cars.....they are going to be a reality very soon, in our lifetime

probably! He was of the opinion that we somehow only consider the First Order Impact (which is disruption in this case) but what about 2nd & 3rd Order impact? Why don't we give a thought to that too? Mr. Iyer gave one good example and left the audience with plenty to think about. He said imagine what will happen to the oil producing countries... the impact on the socio economic status of the gulf countries. Think of all the gas stations which will have to close down! Automated cars will have no accidents which means there will be no need for accident insurance, parking problems and congestion will be eased out too.

The Last Speaker of the day was Mr. Parag Desai. He has a successful career in FMCG Industry he worked in organisations: Godrej, HUL, Biersdorf (Nivea - Hansaplast), Anchor (FMCG). 29 Successful "Zero Level" start up at Anchor resulting today into a Rs. 500 Crs Brands like **Anchor Toothpaste** and DYNA Beauty Soaps. Now, Head of Sales & Marketing in MITCHELL - USA, he is repeating history again by spearheading zero startup operation with MITCHELL cosmetics into India and Saarc countries.

His topic was FMCG "The way Forward". Initially commenting about his success as a marketing genius he said it is always good team work and success cannot be attributed to any one person. It is always Team-Work and Networking that helps in Creating and building a brand.

Mr. Desai said FMCG consists of large categories of products comprising of personal care, household items and food and beverages. This is a very promising and resilient sector and will continue to grow. However, Patanjali has come in as a



game changer, upsetting the apple cart for many established players in the market. The growth trigger he said directly affects the GDP. He felt, compared to world cinema, Indian film industry has a long way to go. Digitalization has resulted in huge growth of the entertainment industry. Indian television industry has a high growth prospect which is 4 times the size of Indian Film Industry. With increase in regional viewership, regional television is one of the prominent areas.

Mr. Asit Kumar Modi is an Indian TV producer and Director; he founded a television company Neela Telefilms Private Limited in 1995. He is best

known for Taarak Mehta ka Oolta Chashma. His team of actors are so popular that they were among the first citizens to be named brand ambassadors for Clean India Campaign. He started with explaining how life style of people is constantly changing. It has become easy as things are conveniently available because of the new and innovative technology. Now a day's people don't have to even wait on the roads for taxis because on call services like Uber and Ola. When somebody wants any information, he can easily go to internet and Goggle it. He doesn't have to look here and there. It is effortless. Today's audience wants to explore new things. The biggest threats for the entertainment sector are the news channels. One research shows that the competition within them is forcing them to dramatize news delivery; hence they are becoming a threat to entertainment.

We tend to copy foreign stories that are not original to us. When we see our culture there is so much to draw from, there are 16 languages but none of our youth is speaking these languages. They all are switching to the one mixed language. Indian Film Industry is also huge with big budgets and manpower, but when it comes to professional training, there aren't enough media institutes. There is a big gap between demand and supply and that needs to be addressed. Mr. Modi urged all the people and appealed to the MSU to take up the initiative to teach and generate more professionally trained creative artists. Ending his talk he said establishing such media institutes to encourage formal education in this sector is the need of the day.

8th Edition of Igniting Minds Young India (IMYI 2017)



The Cooperative Development Committee organized its annual seminar on "Drip, DBT & Use of Fertilizer", on 9th January 2018 at The Gateway Hotel (TaJ) This Cooperative Seminar was in the memory of Late Shri Sarvesh Chandra Mathur. Delegates and experts from agricultural as well as industrial sectors was invited to share their experiences. Congratulations to our Past President Shri Devanshu Vaishnav and his team for spearheading the event

Inaugural Session: Chief Guest **Mr. Dileep Sanghani**, Chairman GUJCOMASOL, Ahmedabad, had inaugurated this seminar with lightening of the lamp. While addressing Mr. Sanghani had appreciated BMA

activities and thrash upon that, GUJCOMASOL is ready to serve the farmers of Gujarat. The other speakers were Mr. C K Patel, Sr. Manager, Agronomy, NETAFIM Irrigation India Pvt Ltd spoke on Drip Irrigation. He started by giving a brief history of Drip

Irrigation, which was first pioneered and patented in Israel. The irrigation company called Netafim was formed and they developed the first practical surface drip

Here water is distributed directly into the soil near the roots through a special slow-release device. If the drip irrigation system is properly designed,

installed, and managed, it helps to conserve water by reducing evaporation and deep drainage. Water can be more precisely applied to the plant roots. In addition, drip can eliminate many diseases that are spread through irrigation water and are adaptable to any farmable slope and is suitable for most soils.

The advantages are many:

- Fertilizer and nutrient loss is minimized due to localized application.
- Water application efficiency is high if managed correctly.
- Field leveling is not necessary.
- Fields with irregular shapes are easily accommodated.
- Recycled non-potable water can







be safely used.

- Moisture within the root zone can be maintained at field capacity.
- Soil type plays less important role in frequency of irrigation.
- Soil erosion is lessened.
- Weed growth is lessened.
- Water distribution is highly uniform, controlled by output of each nozzle.
- Labour cost is less than other irrigation methods.
- Variation in supply can be regulated by through valves and drippers.
- Waste of fertilizers can be minimal.
- Foliage remains dry, reducing the risk of disease.
- Usually operated at lower pressure reducing energy costs.

Mr. Manubhai Asodaria – Sr. Marketing Manager, GSFC spoke on Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) in Fertilizer. He said that Department of Fertilizers - GOI has implemented to release subsidy of Fertilizers for Agriculture use in line with LPG i.e. Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) from 1st February 2018. Initially DOF started DBT system in 16 pilot districts of various states since October'16. Now it has been extended to all the states. There is no change in price of fertilizers which are sold through POS machine and by existing retailers. The only difference of DBT implementation is - there is no deposition in ultimate user bank account, like Gas subsidy but when the farmer gets the fertilizer from retailer, the company will get the subsidy amount. Farmers bring their Adhar Card or the registration number of application for Adhar plus Election Card

or Kissan Credit card while purchasing fertilizers. All retailers of fertilizers have been trained by Fertilizers Company with the help of concern state agriculture department for implementation of DBT Scheme in last few months. The motto of implementation of DBT in fertilizer is to restrict diversion of fertilizers other than Agriculture use and transparency in system of distribution / sales of Fertilizer. It is also for motivation to digital payment. Farmers will get the required fertilizers and subsidy for the farmers only, will be justified. This is one big step in current scenario.

Mr. Janak Kumar Mathasoliya, Dy. Director of Agriculture (INPUT), Vadodara spoke on 'Latest Policy of FCO for storage of fertilizer for society and retailer'. Agriculture plays a crucial role in the Indian economy; about 60 per cent of India's workforce is dependent on agriculture and allied activities. The fertilizer policy in India has been driven by socio-political objectives of making fertilizer available to farmers at affordable prices, and has been under strict government control. A price and distribution control system was considered to be necessary to ensure fair prices and equal distribution and provide incentives to improve agricultural productivity and production. All fertilizers

were distributed through State agencies and routed through cooperatives. The system comprises the following categories of dealers: - Cooperatives - Institutional Agencies such as Agro Industries Corporation, etc. - Wholesale distributors, - Small dealers. Company-run retail outlets, e.g. IFFCO. The FCO and Fertilizer Quality: Fertilizer is the most critical and costly input for sustaining agricultural production and ensuring food security in a country. The Fertilizer Control Order (FCO), 1985, enacted under The Essential Commodities Act, 1955, is being implemented to regulate the trade, price, quality and distribution of fertilizers in the country. The State Governments are the enforcement agencies for implementation of the provisions of the FCO and are adequately empowered to take action against those who indulge in production and sale of non standard/spurious fertilizers.

Mr. N. S. Patel, Sr. State Marketing Manager, IFFCO spoke on balance fertilization. For farmers it means application of nutrient both macro and micro nutrient with organic fertilizer to the crop on the basis of self-analysis. Due to imbalanced of nutrient in crop effect on production, as well as effect on soil fertility, For better growth development of plant and more production crops require 17 plant nutrient, general ratio of N, P & K for crop is 4:2:1 but it is better that before application of NP&K soil analysis is carried out.

Panel gave their valuable views on judicious use of chemical fertilizer, pre

and post effect of implementation of DBT in fertilizer through pos machines. Shri Kataria assured the co-operative officials that GUJCOMASOL is planning to train two officers for DBT and POS related issues for smooth running. Shri Rupapara gave assurance to equal distribution of urea among societies during Rabi season of 2017-2018. The panel addressed questions raised by the participants of seminar.
